The Human Rights Certificate requires six courses:

- Introduction to Human Rights Gateway Course;
- four elective courses; and
- Research in Human Rights Capstone, which provides indepth mentored research with faculty working in human rights.

Human Rights courses are cross listed in over 10 departments.
