HUMAN RIGHTS CERTIFICATE SAMPLE PATHWAYS

The Human Rights Certificate requires a selection of six courses: the Introduction to Human Rights Gateway Course, four elective courses and the Research in **Human Rights Capstone** that provides in-depth mentored research with faculty working in human rights. Human Rights courses are cross listed in over 10 departments. Certificate students are also encouraged to integrate classroom knowledge with experiential components like **DukeEngage** and **DukeImmerse**. Overall, the Certificate program is designed to give students analytical, conceptual, empirical and practical knowledge that prepares them to be engaged, informed and active citizens.
